4 BRADLEY: Thank you for your time and attention.

5 SHEEHAN: Thank you. Sandra Barrett? And then Phil Hardy  
6 and then Jan Wilkins? Again state your name, last name. Spell your last name  
7 and provide your address for the record please

8 BARRETT: Sandy Barrett, B-a-r-r-e-t-t and I live at 804 Brown  
9 Squirrel Lane.

10 SHEEHAN: You want to change the name of that road too?

11 BARRETT: You bet. I'm tired of spelling it to tell you the truth.

12 My name is Sandy Barrett and I live at 804 Brown Squirrel Lane in the  
13 Stonebridge Subdivision. I am here tonight to voice my opposition to the HDTV  
14 and the super tower and to ask you to vote against it. We are new residents to  
15 Golden and could not have dreamed of loving Golden and our neighbors more  
16 than we do. However if this tower goes up we would have to give it all up rather  
17 than risk our children's health. I understand that more studies need to be done  
18 to be completely conclusive that these levels of radiation will cause cancer or  
19 leukemia in our children, but the medical studies discussed by the Doctors at  
20 last week's hearing have enough evidence for me to think it's not a good idea to  
21 put the children in our neighborhoods at risk. As it is my ten month old son was  
22 born with two genetic defects that no one else in our family has. He had to  
23 undergo surgery as a seven month old baby. There are two women that I know

1 of in the Stonebridge Subdivision who recently had miscarriages and last week  
2 you heard from Wendy Hess whose son was also born with two unexplained  
3 genetic abnormalities. Now I don't have the expertise to say conclusively that all  
4 these prenatal problems were caused by the low levels of radiation generated by  
5 the existing towers but I don't think Lake Cedar Group can conclusively say  
6 otherwise either. Until they can I don't think you should even consider  
7 increasing the radiation exposure for thousands of families living around Lookout  
8 Mountain. Excuse me I should have said, I don't think they should even  
9 consider increasing the radiation. I understand the FCC has mandated that all  
10 television stations provide HDTV transmissions by 2006 but I know they didn't  
11 mandate Lookout Mountain. It seems the only reason Lake Cedar Group wants  
12 Lookout Mountain instead of a different location is because they own the land on  
13 Lookout Mountain. This financial concern cannot outweigh the health concerns  
14 of our children. Commissioners, I urge you to think of your legacy, the legacy  
15 that you will be for Jefferson County. You heard the medical testimony last  
16 week that demonstrated that long term exposure to low levels of RF radiation  
17 has been associated with increases in leukemia, birth defects, miscarriages and  
18 immune disorders. If you pass this proposal today, in five or ten years,  
19 Jefferson County could be the new Love Canal filled with cancer clusters and  
20 birth defects. You shouldn't let Lake Cedar Group link this potential catastrophe  
21 to your names and your legacies. Please don't let them put you in this position  
22 and please don't put me in a position where I have no other choice but to move

1 from the home and community that my family and I love. Please vote no on the  
2 super tower. Thank you.

3 SHEEHAN: Thank you Sandra. Phil Hardy and then Jan Wilkins  
4 and then Lili Shelton?

5 HARDY: I am Phil Hardy, H-a-r-d-y. And I live at 658 Entrado  
6 Drive, Golden, Colorado. Just over the hill over there. A friend of mine about  
7 two months ago had mentioned something about the tower and I didn't think too  
8 much about it at the time and then this morning as I was driving up to work I saw  
9 the signs up saying you know saying (inaudible) the tower and when I got to  
10 work I inaudible so I went on line and found some information and what I found  
11 provoked me to turn up here tonight and perhaps it has to a lot of people as well.  
12 It's not a minor thing that seems to be happening here. You have people from  
13 all walks of life turning up voicing their opinion today and apparently 97% or  
14 something are against this and that's the point I want to make is that your  
15 constituents are saying no. I've only been here two years myself. I had no idea  
16 about the tower when I moved in nor any of the problems up on the hill. My wife  
17 just had a miscarriage. Whether it's connected or not I don't know but that's my  
18 point. And also just to finish up is there's a lot of cheap playing going on on top  
19 of the hill. Would you like to buy one of those houses to live in it? I'm actually  
20 thinking now that perhaps we should sell ourselves and move out but we would  
21 take a huge loss. We intend to start a family. That doesn't seem like a good  
22 idea either so what can we do? Thank you.
