

1 preservation, trail purposes, wildlife habitat and natural resource preservation".  
2 To implement this critical preservation effort you and other County  
3 Commissioners have expended 56.4 million dollars of our taxpayer's funds to  
4 preserve 17,000 acres of backdrop. It is inconsistent to say the least to spend  
5 56.4 million dollars of our money to preserve these key lands and then turn  
6 around and approve it's defacement. It's also contrary to the intent of the 72%  
7 of the voters who voted to approve the SOS bond funds so the County would  
8 preserve it's scenic lands. In conclusion I urge you to use your police powers to  
9 deny this proposal because it does not promote the health, safety and welfare of  
10 the citizens in Jefferson County. Thank you.

12 Not here? Okay Lynn Milliken? Lynn Milliken? Not here? Okay Sonia Carney  
13 then Steve Dixon. Sonia?

14 CARNEY: Hello my name is Sonia Carney and I live at 1111  
15 Ash Street, number 609, Denver Colorado 80220. For a long time I lived up on  
16 the mountain with my parents and I could continue to live there and commute to  
17 school. I am going to the University of Colorado Health Sciences next year to  
18 pursue cancer research. But I moved because I could. I could get out without  
19 selling my house. I could just take everything I earned and put into another  
20 place. Other people aren't that lucky. They can't move because they can't sell  
21 their house. They have tried and tried again. They have tried selling it at half  
22 the appraised value. It doesn't work because there is nowhere to go. But I don't  
23 want to speak to you about the housing issue so much as I want to speak to you

1 as a baby scientist. I just graduated from the University of Washington where I  
2 was pursuing a degree in biology. I choose that school because of Dr. Henry  
3 Lai and also because of the ability to research there. Dr. Lai has spoken with  
4 the community a lot about his research with radiation. And I may briefly go into  
5 what I have found in my three years working for him at the end but I have to be  
6 careful because it's not patented yet. I am pursuing cancer research because I  
7 think that it's one of the fields that is growing very rapidly. The first thing you  
8 learn in science is that nothing is absolute. No result does not equal a negative  
9 result. You have to understand that when you are saying there is no proof that it  
10 causes cancer. No proof doesn't mean that it's not going to happen. One thing  
11 I learned is that every year I had to buy a new textbook for biology. Things are  
12 changing so rapidly you have to allow for time and keep up with everything in  
13 order to stay current in the field . It's not an option. If you want to go somewhere  
14 with biology you have to maintain everything you're learning all the time. You  
15 have to read journal articles and you have to stay up because things cannot  
16 maintain at the current rates that they're going. In order to prove something  
17 scientifically you can gather a lot of data but the data doesn't necessarily cause  
18 the final outcome. You have to understand that you take your science and you  
19 take it for what you have but there's always going to be people in the future that  
20 can approve or disprove your theory. I don't think that we should approve this  
21 while we are waiting for the results of the CSU study. I think that we need that  
22 at least to have a current outlook on the field. So I think that you should deny

1 the proposal or at least put it on hold until the results of that study are finalized  
2 and presented. Thank you. Any questions?

3 SHEEHAN: No. Thank you, Sonia. Steve Dixon? Steve Dixon?
