3 represent. I do want to just again support your, this proposal and ask for a yes  
4 vote.

5 SHEEHAN: Okay Hugh McIsaac and it looks like Scott Coors.  
6 Did he already testify?

7 MCISAAC: Good evening. I'm Hugh McIsaac. That's M-C-I-S-  
8 A-A-C. I live with my wife and three children at 312 Crawford Court not far from  
9 Shelton Elementary School. I teach biology at the University of Denver and  
10 have a PHD in biology. My specific expertise is in bird navigation and migration  
11 but tonight I wish to buck the trend and I will not be discussing my expertise.

12 SHEEHAN: Cause I was going to ask you about West Nile virus  
13 but go ahead.

14 MCISAAC: No. There are several issues that I think are  
15 important concerning birds with these towers but it seems to me the overriding  
16 and most important issue is health and so that's what I wish to address today.  
17 So rather I will summarize a line of reasoning and a course of action that I think  
18 appropriate. First I think for this community the only acceptable course of action  
19 is no increase and risk of health. We do not want to see a rise in any issues  
20 concerning cancer or other potentially RF related diseases. Second there have  
21 been a number of presentations from the medical community that give fairly  
22 strong indications that RF has significant medical and health related risks  
23 associated with it. Third, viable alternative sites have been presented as

1 possible sites for placing these new towers and therefore I would recommend  
2 and like to see that this proposal be rejected. Finally I would like to propose that  
3 the existing towers be brought down early because they seemed although the  
4 study is ongoing and not yet in there is some suggestion that these might be  
5 causing health problems as well. And it would benefit the community and I think  
6 the community would welcome an early removal of these towers as well. And  
7 that could be done in cooperation with the Lake Cedar Group. There might be  
8 creative ways that viable economic alternatives could be found but I think there  
9 would be a tremendous amount of support if we could remove these towers.
