

1 this application means that nothing changes on Lookout Mountain. If the  
2 broadcasters are required to go elsewhere for their digital transmitter like they  
3 have already, they're broadcasting from downtown. They will just wait until the  
4 analog is rescinded and they don't have to broadcast analog anymore and they  
5 will begin broadcasting digitally from Lookout. You will have passed your  
6 opportunity to improve Lookout Mountain and as far as I know that's the only  
7 opportunity you have in front of you to improve Lookout Mountain. That's all I  
8 have to say.

9 SHEEHAN: Okay thank you Ron. Mario? Then on deck David  
10 Wheeler, Jim Oleskevich.

11 PASQUALE: You guys need some coffee. Get up and stretch  
12 here. All awake and ready to go?

13 SHEEHAN: I think I'm awake.

14 PASQUALE: Mario Pasquale, P-A-S-Q-U-A-L-E. I live at 806  
15 Brown Squirrel Lane in Golden and we were wondering if you could change the  
16 name of the street to Black Squirrel with big teeth and very angry.

17 UNKNOWN: Could you put that in front of the Commissioner's  
18 Bill?

19 TUTHILL: We'd like to add that to your Wednesday agenda.

20 SHEEHAN: Okay. It's on Wednesday's agenda.

21 PASQUALE: Okay. The Lake Cedar Group campaign is we want  
22 less. Vote yes. And I think I finally figured out what the hidden agenda of this is.  
23 First we want less opposition from the community and from Jefferson County.

1 They have the sketches and I will speak to this point in just a moment. Secondly  
2 they want less caring from you for your constituents. Many of us live in  
3 communities with Homeowner Association bylaws that we have to conform with.  
4 Yet Lake Cedar Group is requesting that you adopt a non conforming use for the  
5 land without regard to the effect it will have on your constituents. Lastly I  
6 strongly believe that they are opting for the location that will cost them less to  
7 develop and seem to disregard the alternate sites. I am the director of treasury  
8 and planning for a manufacturing company here in Denver and it is my  
9 responsibility to assist our executive committee in making very tough decisions  
10 concerning how we manage our company. Obviously a big part of my analysis  
11 is the cost involved in the return investment. Rarely though do we choose the  
12 least cost option because more often than not it's not the correct decision and  
13 it's not the correct decision here. To expand on my first point even with that  
14 much pressure with the super tower until recently this community, specifically  
15 Golden, has rallied in opposition of this project. While LCG has the finances to  
16 support it's case the community has been supported by only what we as  
17 members of the community have contributed. All the banners, buttons, shirts,  
18 flyers, information, time and testimony have been donated. Let me give you a  
19 quick summary how much this community your constituents are overwhelmingly  
20 opposed to this project and how much support for a no vote has been  
21 generated. There have been close to 3,600 petition signers mostly from the  
22 residents of the community. Over 580 people showed up here last week to  
23 voice their opinion of which 560 are against this proposal. That's over 97%. I'm

1 sure that any of you would love to have that kind of support in an election. Over  
2 30 homeowners associations have turned out to present and oppose this. The  
3 city of Golden unanimously opposes this project. Members of the Administration  
4 faculty of the Colorado School of Mines have voiced their opposition. Jefferson  
5 County Public Schools have expressed their concern over the real or  
6 unnecessary risk their faculty and students could be exposed to if this proposal  
7 passes, specifically Ralston and Shelton. Al Hislop's work has shown the  
8 adverse affects may extend much farther throughout Jefferson County. This  
9 community has shown tremendous opposition to this project, banded together,  
10 walked door to door, made phone calls, spent countless hours of our time to  
11 voice our opposition. Don't get us wrong. We're not opposed to technological  
12 advancement. I was born and raised in Denver and I have seen it grow and  
13 change with my lifetime. I would love to have DSL in my neighborhood and I'm  
14 very interested in HDTV but I also like to see the light of day. I moved to Golden  
15 specifically to hike, bike, play tennis and jog and spend time in my garden.

16 SHEEHAN: Okay. Mario, please wrap up.

17 PASQUALE: Yes. In fact many of these things I used to do with  
18 my dog Ruby a wonderful six year old Golden setter. She is with us tonight in  
19 this tin can. We had to put her down in February much before her time. She  
20 contracted leukemia which was very, very rare in the breed. Is there a  
21 connection? I'm not willing to think that there was not nor was our veterinarian.  
22 In closing I'm recently married and thinking of starting a family with my beautiful  
23 wife, but I am very hesitant to do so (inaudible) in these hearings. Will I move if

1           there's (inaudible). Quite possibly. Do I want to? Absolutely not. Thank you  
2           very much.

3           SHEEHAN:                    Thank you Mario. Okay David Wheeler? Jim  
4           Oleskevich? Either one here? Gordon Hamilton? Gordon Hamilton? Okay Dr.  
5           Dorothy Colagiovanni? Dr. Dorothy, don't want to butcher that name again?  
6           Not here? Okay. Jeanne Fritch? Jeannie Fritch? Did she already testify? That  
7           sounds familiar. Not here? Theresa Shelton? Theresa Shelton, then Warren  
8           Kennison Jr. and Shane Henry?

9           SHELTON:                    Good evening, I'm Teresa Shelton. S-h-e-l-t-o-n. I
